

Timetable of Works

<p>Each year Independent Noise Specialists will determine the properties that are eligible based on the noise contours.</p>
<p>The London Luton Airport Consultative Committee (LLACC) Noise Insulation Sub-Committee will prioritise the properties for insulation each year.</p>
<p>London Luton Airport will directly contact the eligible property owners selected for Noise Insulation each year.</p>
<p>Property owners wishing to accept the offer of insulation must do so within 30 days. Alternatively, any property owners wishing to decline insulation must submit this in writing to LLA. However, these property owners will be contacted again in 5 years.</p>
<p>If the owner accepts insulation, our contractor will arrange an appointment with the property owner for a survey to be carried out.</p>
<p>Once approved by LLA the work will commence at a suitable time for the property owner.</p>

Bathrooms, kitchens, halls, stairways and conservatories are not eligible for insulation.

Common Questions

Q From my location I think I am within the required contours but I haven't been contacted, what should I do?

All eligible residential properties within the qualifying contour have been contacted directly. The LLACC Noise Insulation Sub-Committee continues to review and determine properties for insulation. If you believe your property falls within the contour and you have not been contacted, please get in touch using the contact details below so that we can review your details.

Q I rent the property, can I get insulation?

Only the property owner can accept insulation. Therefore if your property is selected you will need to pass the information to the property owner.

Q What are the types of insulation available?

Installations of double glazing, secondary glazing, ventilators and loft insulation can all be installed as part of the scheme. Secondary glazing will add another layer to the property reducing the noise in the property. Ventilators will bring fresh air into the property without needing to open windows therefore keeping further noise out of the property.

Q How long can I expect the works to take?

From the initial appointment with the appointed contractor to completion of the works it should take no longer than 4 months (subject to the property owners availability).

Q What happens if damage is caused in my property?

Our contractor will 'make good' any damage to your property. However, if this is the case you should also contact London Luton Airport to inform them of any damage.

Noise Insulation Scheme

Information for local communities

Dear Neighbour,

One of the measures involved in reducing noise for our local communities is our **Noise Insulation Scheme**. Together with an Independent Noise analyst and our London Luton Airport Consultative Committee (LLACC) Noise Insulation Sub-Committee, we will be offering insulation to eligible properties each year.

We have produced this leaflet to give an overview of the LLA Noise Insulation Scheme, and to provide further information regarding eligibility as well as answering some frequently asked questions.

Eligible Properties

The scheme covers both **residential and non-residential properties**. Depending on any existing insulation in the property, **double glazing, secondary glazing, ventilation units and loft insulation** can be provided. Rooms eligible for insulation include living rooms, dining rooms, kitchen-diners and bedrooms. Rooms not included in the scheme are kitchens, bathrooms, conservatories, stairways, halls and landings.

Noise Contour

The Noise Contour below indicates the areas exposed to certain noise levels. **Both residential and non-residential properties which lie within this contour are eligible for noise insulation.**

The Noise Contour is similar to that of a weather map. Just as a weather map might have isobars joining points of equal air pressure, a noise contour joins points which have the same noise level.

The Noise Contour is the forecast 2023 noise contour which is **fixed up until 2028**; this allows everyone affected by the worst-case scenario to be treated.
