Since Jan 2016 Starling identified 18+ ha of deforestation within 20km of the mill - the vast majority of which are alleged to have taken place in BCPH, BCPJ, BCPA and CPP plantations, all alleged to be owned by Sulaidy (note 6.7 above and possible link to FR). KAL mill has provided 100% TTP data, but those plantations are, with the exception of its own concession, more distant from the mill than the Sulaidy concessions, which lie to the East and West of the mill. Mongabay and Mighty Rapid Response have both reported on the deforestation, alleging it is connected to KAL. Supplier engagement has improved visibility through the provision of TTP data. Continue to engage suppliers to ensure full visibility of final plantations. Continued engagement with suppliers to increase TTP visibility over time, where full visibility is not achievable then mitigate risks of connection to deforested material via exclusion from supply chain. After a year long investigation, the CBP found "abuse of vulnerability, deception, restriction of movement, isolation, physical and sexual violence, intimidation and threats, retention of identity documents, withholding of wages, debt bondage, abusive working and living conditions, and excessive overtime," along with possible child labour and imposed a Withhold Release Order (import ban into the US) on 30-Sep-2020. On 15th January 2026, WRO was lifted against FGV, its subsidiaries, and joint ventures. CBP website mentions that evidence was presented to them that FGV no longer produces palm oil using forced labour. According to FGV's press release, actions undertaken by FGV include strengthening recruitment procedures, implementing a recruitment fee reimbursement programme, enhancing living conditions for workers, improving access to potable water in remote areas, expanding internet connectivity, implementing digital systems, prioritising workers' voices, strengthened grievance mechanism and collaborating with the National Union of Plantation Workers (NUPW). While this grievance was first reported in 2017, MPH5 mill has entered our supply chain for the first time in 2024. Mighty Earth has included PT MP in several RR reports, most recently in RR 29, and has catalogued over 2k hectares of deforestation between May 2018-January 2020 in areas close to PT MP. Wilmar reported that MP had completed HCS and HCV assessments in September 2018, which is alleged to have found no further HCS forest or areas requiring conservation. However, the HCV and HCS assessment had not followed the correct process and were not available for scrutiny. As deforestation continued, they were pressured to submit both for peer review. In September 2020, this finally happened for the HCV assessment, but not the HCS report. By the end of 2020, the concession was completely cleared. Berau and Segah Mills were previously implicated by proximity, however both have evidenced no connection to MP plantation.
