MAKE IT A GOOD MORNING

It's never been more important to start the day off right for you and for your students. A big part of that is ensuring your classroom is set up with cleanliness in mind so you can focus your attention on what you love most.

TEACHING OUR KIDS.

Next you'll find a series of duties and activities for both you and your kids to get your classroom ready for the day. It all adds up to a happier, healthier classroom for all.

DUTIES FOR TEACHERS

1. Disinfect desktops with wipes*
(see page 7 for usage)
2. Use disinfectant to wipe high touch surfaces like doorknobs, light switches & drinking fountains
3. Recite the pledge for protection
(see page 6). Once students have learned, assign 1 student per week to lead the protection pledge



DUTIES FOR KIDS

4. Open windows (if applicable)
to increase ventilation
5. Lead morning protection pledge



THE PLEDGE TO PROTECT

I will never stop fighting
To make sure I do the right thing.
To stop the spread of germs
And remember the things I've learned
I'll wash my hands so clean
It's part of my routine
If I cough or sneeze I know.
I always use my elbow. (motion arm up)
You'll never need to ask.
Because we're all up to the task!
Together, we pledge to protect each other!

TIP: for older grades, have students write a protection pledge of their own.

* RECOMMENDED WIPES USAGE

1. For the convenient cleaning and disinfection of small, non-porous hard surfaces and objects up to about the size of a desk.

- Shared computer mouse and keyboard
- Tablets such as an iPad
- Smartphone screens
- Monitor screens
- Doorknobs, door handles, handrails
- Faucet handles, toilet handles, toilet stall door locks
- Light switches
- Drinking fountain including the 'on/off' button/toggle
- Windowsills
- Non-wood furniture

2. Use adequate number of wipes to wet surface – recommended: 1 wipe per desk

- Allow the surface to remain wet for 45 seconds then allow to air dry or dry with a clean microfiber cloth.
- If used on toys rinse with clean water.
- If used on electronic devices, unplug before disinfecting with wipe.
- Dispose in trash out of reach from children.

Please note: Do not flush. Not to be used on unfinished or oiled wood, unsealed tile or carpets.

Keep wipes out of reach of children. Always read and follow the label.

All right! You're half way through your day.

LET'S DO LUNCH

Now, it's all about making sure you're setting the stage for your kids to have a clean, orderly (and tasty!) lunch. Be sure to remind them, that while they may be taking a break from learning, they're not taking a break from helping stop the spread of germs.

So, no sharing of food or supplies.



DUTIES FOR TEACHERS

1. Instruct or take kids to wash hands with soap and water for 20 seconds after recess & before and after snack/mealtime

[In the event soap & water is not accessible, use hand sanitizer]

2. Play music of your choice as you lead the clean up song

Lunch time is over and it was really yummy.

Ate all my food, now it's sitting in my tummy.

Apple cores and sandwich crust, I pick up all my trash.

Put it in my backpack and take it home from class.



3. Have soap, water & paper towels available for wiping surfaces/spills during and after eating.

4. Distribute a dry paper towel to each student

DUTIES FOR KIDS

1. Collect lunch trash and place in backpack to take home to parents OR place in designated trashcan (while music plays)

2. After teacher has wet surfaces with soap & water, wipe with a dry paper towel

BEFORE YOU HEAD HOME

The end of the day is here! Just a few more things to do and you can head home knowing that you've helped protect your students and their loved ones from the spread of germs. There's no better feeling than that.

DUTIES FOR TEACHERS

- 1 Close windows
- 2 Disinfect desktops with disinfectant spray*
(see page 12 for usage)
- 3 Spray any carpeted areas or upholstered furniture



*RECOMMENDED SPRAY USAGE

For quick, convenient disinfection and sanitization of multiple surfaces, when cleaning is not necessary or practical.

HARD SURFACES

- Door Knobs/ Door handles / Door push bars
- Faucet handles, toilet handles, toilet stall door locks
- Light switches
- Drinking fountain including the 'on/off' button/toggle
- Trash cans
- Toilet surfaces including seats
- Urinals
- Windowsills
- Telephones (not cellular)
- Non-wood furniture
- Hallway walls
- Stair railings

SOFT SURFACES

- Upholstered furniture
- Carpet

If soiled pre-clean first.

- 1** Hold can upright 6" to 8" from the surface to be disinfected.

Spray until the surface is wet, about 3 to 5 seconds.

Spray every desk in classroom with Lysol Disinfectant Spray until surface is thoroughly wet allowing 45 seconds for the product to work.
- 2** Follow the same action/order - fold microfiber cloth during cleaning, as best able, to prevent using the same side of the cloth repeatedly.
- 3** Change out microfiber cloth at least once as you move through the classroom desks.

Please note: Not to be used on polished wood, painted surfaces, leather, rayon, silk, satin fabrics or acrylic plastics.

In the event spray (or wipes) are not available, triggers can be used in the following fashion:

- 3 quick sprays across desktop to cover surface with fine mist.
- After all desks have been sprayed, go back to first desk and wipe with brown paper towel, folding towel in the process.

Allow remaining product to air dry.

- Clean other desks the same way, changing towel every 2-3 desks
- In rooms with tables instead of desks, use the same protocol (mist entire surface with cleaner, allow 60 seconds before cleaning with paper towels).
