# Digital Will

### 1. What is a Digital Will?

A Digital Will is a legally valid will created and stored in a secure digital format, allowing an individual to clearly document how their estate should be distributed after death.

### 2. How is a Digital Will different from a traditional Will?

The primary difference lies in the format and storage. A Digital Will is created and securely stored electronically, while still complying with applicable legal requirements for validity.

An Executor is appointed in the Will to administer the estate. Where designated, a Trustee may act as Executor and oversee proper distribution in line with the documented wishes.

### 8. Can I update my Digital Will?

Yes. A Digital Will may be reviewed and updated during your lifetime, provided changes comply with required legal formalities.

### 9. How is my information protected?

The Digital Will is stored using secure systems and is subject to data protection and confidentiality controls in line with regulatory standards.

### 10. What happens after death?

Upon death, the appointed Executor applies for probate where required, settles liabilities and distributes the estate in accordance with the Will.

### 11. What documents are required to create a Digital Will?

Clients must complete onboarding documentation, provide valid identification and satisfy full KYC requirements before the Will is prepared.
