Viridis, our *Colour of the Year 2024*, is the perfect colour partner for New Eden



2015 marked the start of our annual tradition with our first Design of the Year, Northern Rose. Our next Design of the Year, Marble was bang on trend in 2016, with a contemporary marble texture and deep moody colour palette. Continuing to follow the trends, Reflections was our Design of the Year 2017. This geometric design features the rose golds and millennial pinks that defined this era.

Our Design of the Year 2018 Pierre Pink is a feminine floral with more hints of muted pink and a twist of metallic gold in the background. Tori Teal marked the end of the 2010s as our Design of the Year 2019. This delicate floral design still stands the test of time with a classic teal colour palette and elegant birds

During the year of the pandemic, our Design of the Year 2020 Bloomsbury Neo Mint brought a muchneeded brightness and optimism to our homes with pastel florals and elegant butterflies. 2021 marked the year of our 75th anniversary and we celebrated with Timepiece Amethyst. In conversation with

THE BOTANICAL BOYS

Founders Darren Henderson and Ben Nel

WHERE DID THE IDEA COME FROM?

It began as a hobby, building fish bowl terrariums with succulents around a small dining table. It is such a fun way to spend time - forming a mini landscape, and we made little scenes to remind us of our holidays to South Africa. It became a way of focusing on something creative after a long day at our 9-5 office jobs.

Darren took some in to his office to dress his desk and his colleagues started to enquire about them. We joined an online education platform and put together a lesson plan and we started getting booking enquiries. 6 years later we are still teaching this fascinating subject and helping to connect thousands of people across the city to nature.

WHAT WAS THE BIGGEST HURDLE YOU OVERCAME?

Opening our first shop in Kings Cross was a scary prospect - moving our classes from the dining table at home to a public space. We've also built a lot of supply chains and networks around the world to bring unique old treasures to our range, which was a massive hurdle in many ways - navigating the entire process of containment shipping and storage solutions.

The key thing we learned in overcoming new challenges is the importance of building strong relationships with your supply chain and people around you.

WHAT WELLNESS BENEFITS DO TERRARIUMS HAVE?

There are huge wellness benefits in building terrariums and planting living plants. The terrarium experience encourages focus and creative thinking. Our planting classes help people learn about plant care, which in turn gives confidence and knowledge when considering buying plants.

A terrarium has visual intrigue and the science of plants in a self paced guide. enclosed containers is always a great talking point. Our team produce a vast range of terrarium landscapes and styled plants in old vintage pots at our Kings Cross store to help impact your the most sustained home in a beautiful way.

WHY SHOULD PEOPLE BRING NATURE INTO THE HOME?

Having nature around us has many positive mental health benefits and our bespoke pots have a particular visual impact on the aesthetic of an interior.

"Our kits saved us through Covid times and being able to teach people online was a positive period in those darker and difficult times we all faced."

Plants provide oxygen and air purifying qualities which are great for keeping our air clean, such as the Sansevieria plant, one of NASA's top ten chosen plants for air purifying qualities. The very act of nurturing your plants also has many positive benefits to us when we see them thrive in our homes.

WHERE DO YOU FIND YOUR INSPIRATION?

We find planting inspiration from our travels around Africa and we source plants we love from UK and European growers. We love using old vessels from around the world and re-purposing them by pairing with sculptural plants. Our plant styling service connects people to our unique designs that are perfectly suited to modern interior designs, for example we use 200 year old wooden mortars from rural parts of Asia and pair them with a cultural planting.


TELL US A LITTLE BIT ABOUT THE PROCESS BEHIND CREATING AND CARING FOR TERRARIUMS.

A terrarium is a self-sustaining eco system that requires several layers of organic materials to help its natural cycle kick start. For example, we use small clay pellets for the base layer, providing an all-important air pocket draining layer in the glass terrarium. Each layer built has a purpose before plants are placed. We've recently developed bespoke terrarium kits with a self paced quide

Part of our learning has lead us to create our very own bespoke substrate mix (terrarium soil), which we mix in-house to enable the most sustainable environment for the plants. Our kits, launched as a way to connect people to nature at home, are made from recycled cardboard and our labelling uses vegetable inks


Recipe for VIRIDIS PESTO PASTA

 $Ingredients \sim 4 Servings$

80g Fresh Basil
150ml Olive oil
Generous handful of walnuts
2 cloves of garlic
40g parmesan
4 servings of fresh pasta
Salt & pepper to season

Method

- Boil pasta, add a splash of oil and salt to prevent pasta sticking to the pan.
- 2 Place all ingredients into a food processor and blend until smooth or to your preferred consistency.
- 3 Drain pasta (but keep a small amount of pasta water left to mix in with the pesto).
- 4 Add pesto into the pan of pasta and stir on low heat for a couple of minutes.
- 5 Serve up with a sprinkling of grated parmesan and basil!





To Drink FORBIDDEN FRUIT COCKTAIL

Ingredients

60ml of Gin
35ml of Elderflower Cordial
100ml of Cloudy Apple Juice
250ml of Soda Water
1 Red Apple
30g of Fresh Mint
Ice cubes

Method

- 1 Choose your favourite long stem glass, add your elderflower cordial, followed by your gin, then by the cloudy apple juice. Give it a little stir, add ice & then top with soda water.
- 2 Garnish your Forbidden Fruit Cocktail with a slice of apple & a small bunch of mint.
- 3 Lastly, enjoy!




